## **Guideline updates**




The <u>MSF PMTCT and Paediatric Guidelines</u> were updated in 2014. If you haven't seen them yet, they are <u>available here</u>.

# CONFERENCES

#### **Recent conference**

The 22nd <u>Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections (CROI)</u> was held in Seattle, Washington in February 2015, during which the latest studies, important developments, and best research methods in the ongoing battle against HIV/AIDS and related infectious disease were shared. # **Upcoming conferences**

- <u>The International AIDS Society (IAS)</u> conference is taking place in Vancouver, Canada, from July 19-22. Twenty MSF-related abstracts have been accepted as poster presentations, and one oral presentation from the Khayelitsha project titled 'Implementation scale up of the Adherence Club model of care to 30,000 stable ART patients in the Cape Metro: 2011-2014'. MSF's Access Campaign is organising a satellite session on 'Reaching and Maintaining Undetectable Viral Load', jointly with the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the International Treatment Preparedness Coalition (ITPC).
- <u>The 18th International Conference on AIDS and STIs in Africa (ICASA)</u>, originally scheduled to take place in Tunisia, has been moved to Harare, Zimbabwe from Nov 29 to Dec 4. The conference theme is 'AIDS in Post 2015: Linking Leadership, Science & Human Rights'.
- The 46th <u>Union World Conference on Lung Health</u> will take place in Cape Town, South Africa from December 2-6. The five-day scientific programme will address how the 'new agendas' (WHO's Global TB Strategy, Stop TB Partnership's Global Plan to Stop TB, plus the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals) will influence inter-related fights against tuberculosis, HIV, lung disease and non-communicable diseases.
